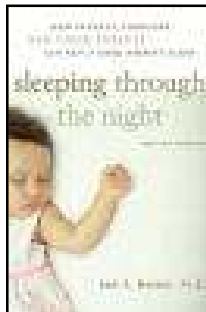
THE HAPPIEST BABY ON THE BLOCK :

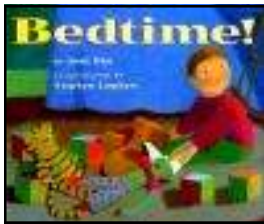

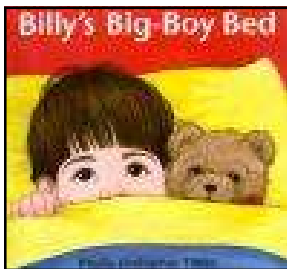
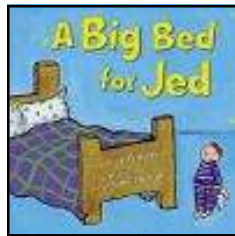
BEDTIME

A BIG BED FOR JED

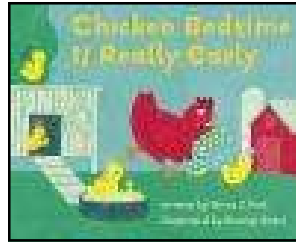

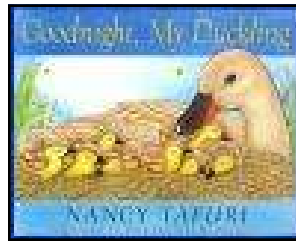
" 'A story, a story!' the young bunnies roar. And just as it ends, all the bunnies beg: 'More!' "

GOODNIGHT, MY DUCKLING

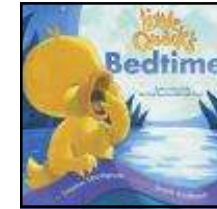

LITTLE QUACK'S BEDTIME

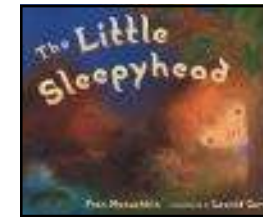
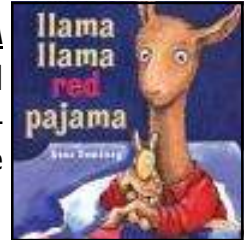
