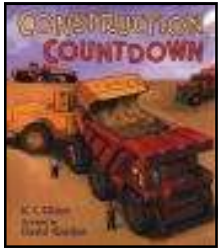

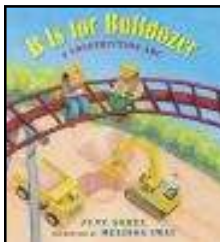
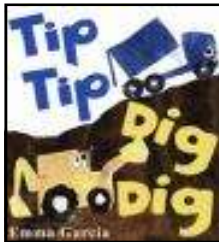

**B IS FOR BULLDOZER**

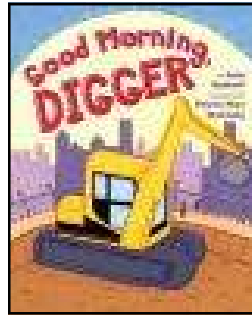
