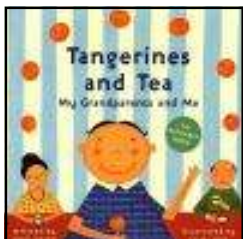

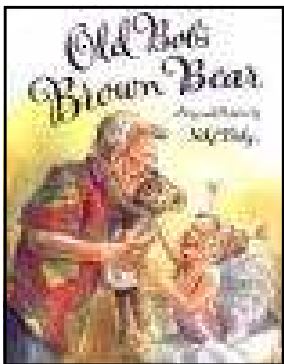
With heartwarming illustrations and fun rhymes, this alphabet book is perfect for grandchildren

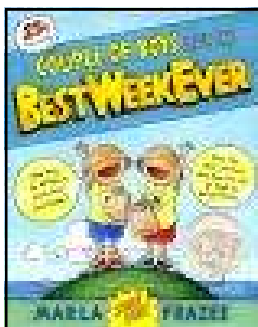
OLD BOB'S BROWN BEAR

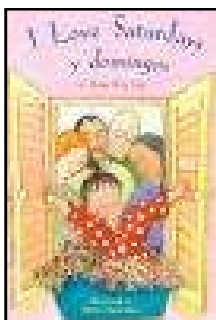
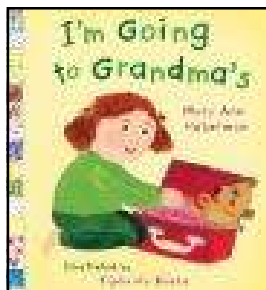
I'M GOING TO GRANDMA'S

American. While the two sets of grandparents are different in many ways, they also have a great deal in common -- in particular, their love for their granddaughter.

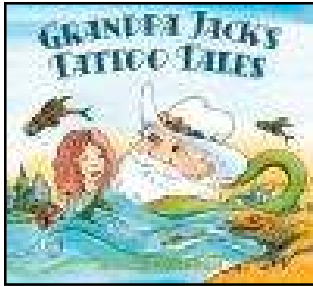

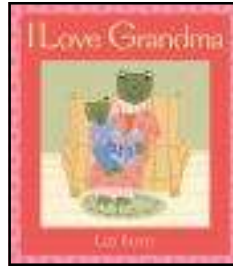
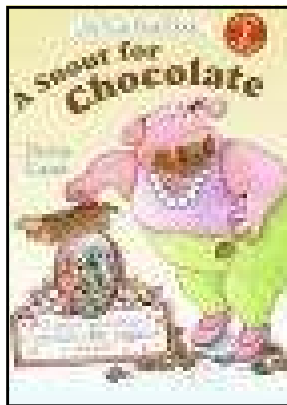
Chloe loves to hear her Grandpa Jack tell stories about his adventures.

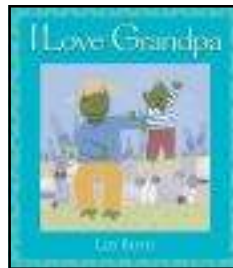

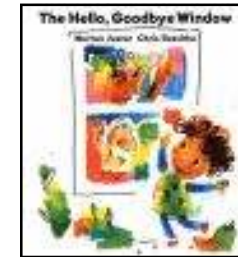
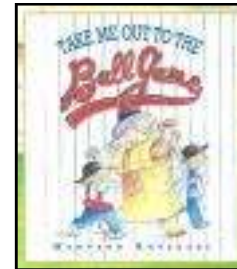

THE HELLO, GOODBYE WINDOW

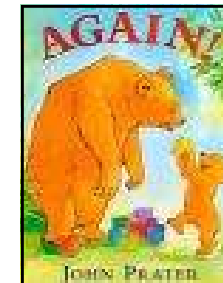
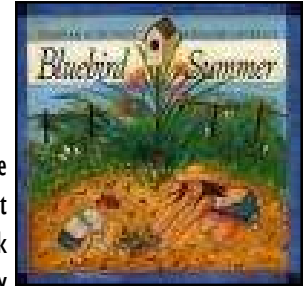
