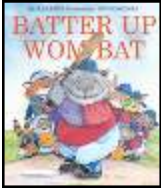

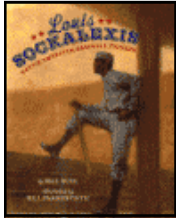

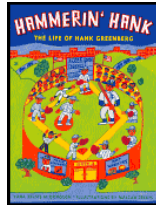
## LOUIS SOCKALEXIS: Native American Baseball Pioneer
