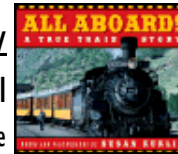

## DINOSAUR TRAIN

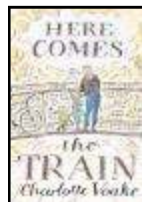

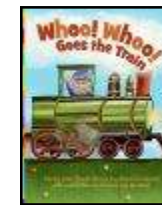
